


# RACE AGAINST TIME

### Discussion Questions

- Looking at the cover, did you find the hidden image? Do you know what it represents? What is the significance of the timepiece on the cover?
- Before reading this book, had you ever heard of Herculaneum?
- If you lived in Herculaneum in 79AD, how do you see yourself in society? As a slave, shopkeeper, farmer, prominent citizen, etc. and why?
- In 1982, three hundred skeletons were found in the boat sheds. There were also a few skeletons found in homes. Herculaneum was believed to have had a population of four thousand. Where do you think the other citizens of Herculaneum went? Or are they still buried in the unexcavated part of town?
- Do you think Mount Vesuvius will erupt again and if so how devastating do you think it will be?
- Richard, Rick, Rich, Richeard, Ricardo, Ricardus (Uncle Richard) was a reappearing character in each time period. Sometimes he was good, sometimes evil. Why do you think the author had a recurring character in the trilogy?
- Who was your favorite character in the series, and why? And who would you cast as that character in the movie (if a movie was ever made from these books)?
- Did you think the time periods were accurately portrayed? Was there too much detail/not enough/just right?
- How did you feel about the ending? How might you change it?
- If you could talk to the author, what burning question would you want to ask?
